Although he never lost the delight in finding beauty in unexpected spaces and moments that was his photography, music became his first love. From his early days digging for undiscovered or neglected treasures for Red Light Records, the store he co-created in Amsterdam, to his astonishingly eclectic DJ sets, to his caring and thoughtful curation for Music from Memory the record label he co-founded, he set out to share extraordinary music with the world. Then, deciding amazing music was best enjoyed with great food and drink in a wonderful setting, he embarked on a new journey, travelled Europe learning everything he could about natural wines and opened up Bar Sway with his wife and friends in Berlin where he lived. One of his friends wrote yesterday that it was sometimes as if Jamie had lived five more lives than any of us.

It has been the words and thoughts shared by his many friends, colleagues and followers across the world, whose lives he touched, and who loved him as fiercely and absolutely as we did as a family, that have brought us comfort over the past days. Especially the many younger artists he not only inspired but, always seeking to learn and grow himself, found time to support and champion. Jamie's passion for life was infectious. It was also what drove him to want to make this world a better place for us all to live in. As another friend of his said: 'Jamie was a rainbow, he was sunshine after rain.
